1 Compassion Fatigue



Compassion fatigue is the gradual lessening of compassion over time due to continuous exposure to the trauma and suffering of others. It's closely linked to secondary traumatic stress, where the helper absorbs the emotional distress of those they support.

This course will allow practitioners to gain a holistic understanding of compassion fatigue. It will look at how to recognise the signs and symptoms, causes and impacts - and will explore how to prevent and manage compassion fatigue. Finally, it will also allow learners to explore the difference between compassion fatigue, burnout and vicarious trauma.

- To recognise the signs and symptoms of compassion fatigue
- To consider the causes and impact of compassion fatigue
- To think about how to prevent and manage compassion fatigue
